

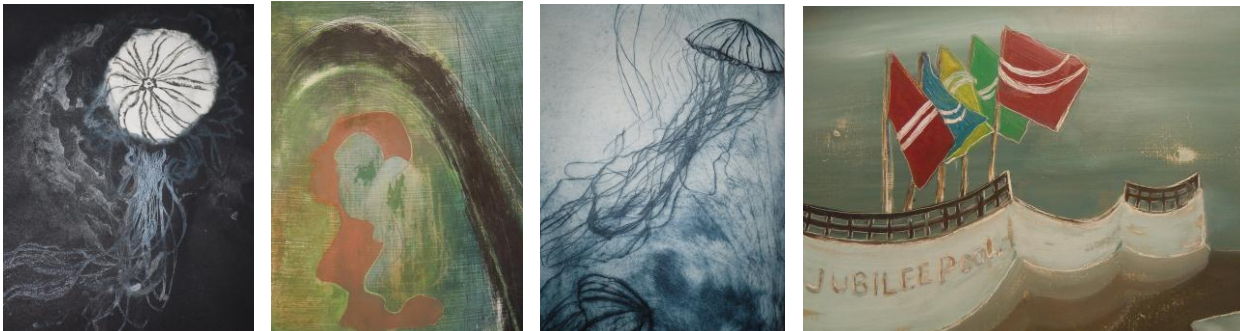

Landfill to Life - the third room

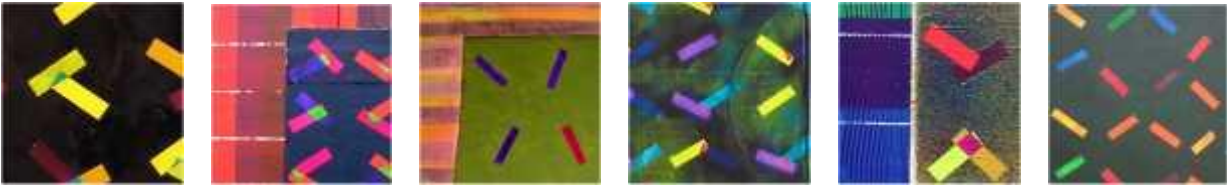
